

## Notes from the Board Meeting of 27 September

### 1. Dress Code

Some slight revisions were made to the Dress Code published in the Club Rules dated 1<sup>st</sup> May 2015. A copy is attached.

### 2. Privacy Policy

The attached Privacy Policy will be appended to the Club Rules and will be published on the web site.

### 3. The Green

Some members have offered to assist the greenkeeper in additional maintenance work. The green will be closed once a month on Monday morning to allow this work to take place.

There have been further incidences of damage to the green, caused by poor bowling technique and failure to use protective mats. Bowlers who are seen to cause damage will be required to use mats if they are unable to improve their delivery.

### 4. Internal Competitions

There were around 20 games decided by a walkover in the early rounds. If you are entering for competitions please be aware that there are only 3 weeks available to complete a round and it is vital that contact is made to agree a date as soon as opponents are known.

### 5. Finals Weekend

In future there will be no Sunday roll-up on Finals weekend to allow more flexibility in planning the programme.

### 6. Mixed Triples League

It was a struggle this year to get 6 teams involved, and we may need to find some new captains for next season.

### 7. Trophies

The condition of the trophies has been reviewed and it has been agreed that worn cups and plates will be replaced as necessary. It was also agreed that in future only Winners' trophies will be engraved.

### 8. Repairs and redecoration

Volunteers are needed to assist with repairs and redecoration of the club sheds. Please sign up on the sheets in the pavilion.

### 9. Bowling in hot weather

The Board were asked to consider whether there should be guidelines regarding bowling in very high temperatures, with specific temperature levels laid down. It was decided that the decision should be left to the captain, who should phone the opposing captain on the day to agree whether the match should take place.

Concern was also raised about the difficulty experienced by emergency vehicles in locating bowling greens and the need to have the Post Code available to pass on to them. We have addressed this problem in our pavilion, and there are notices clearly displayed, but for away matches captains are advised to carry County Yearbooks which detail the address and Post Code of the club they are visiting.

## **DRESS CODE (Revised October 2016)**

### **8. GENERAL**

A) On the green all players shall wear proper brown, grey or white bowling shoes. In matches, all players shall be dressed in uniform as approved by their Section Committee and as indicated on the team sheet.

B) For Surrey Competition the dress code for both Sections shall meet Surrey requirements.

#### **C) INTERNAL GAMES**

**Ladies** – White tops shirt type with collar and sleeves and white or Club Coloured knitwear and grey skirts, alternatively grey tailored trousers, cropped trousers and white/grey tailored shorts may be worn.

**Men** – White shirts/white knitwear and grey trousers White/grey tailored shorts may be worn. Not Club coloured shirts

#### **D) INTERNAL COMPETITIONS**

**Ladies** – Grey below the waist should be worn with white above the waist.

Finals Day – All white.

**Men** – White shirts/white knitwear with grey trousers. Not Club shirts

Finals Day – White shirts with a Club Tie/white knitwear and white trousers.

The Marker will be dressed the same.

#### **E) MATCHES AGAINST OTHER CLUBS**

**Ladies** – White tops shirt type with collar and sleeves, Club Coloured knitwear and white skirts, tailored trousers, cropped trousers in the afternoon but grey in the evening. White tailored shorts may be worn.

**Men** – Club coloured shirts with or without white knitwear or blazers (preferably with Club Badge) and white trousers in the afternoon and grey trousers in the evening. White/grey tailored shorts may be worn as appropriate.

**NB** On match days, please remain in match clothing until after tea.

#### **F) CASUAL GAMES**

Roll ups, weekly events and social/fun drives.

Smart casual clothes can be worn including tailored shorts and cut-off trousers. Ladies collarless blouses can be worn. Men's tops must include a collar.

**NOTE** – T shirts, denim jeans and track suits must not be worn at any time.
